

Physical Education / Games

Inside

French

The children will learn all about the parts of the body in French! They will do this through singing, fun games and practical activities using their bodies. At the end of this unit, the children will get to create their own monster being able to label it correctly with the parts of the body in French as well as using previous learning of numbers and colours.

Design and Technology

Computing:

The children will be completing a unit looking at how computer networks work, how the internet connects to their home allowing them to access a web page and explain what the world wide web is. **More to follow**

Geography:

The children will learn about the reasons why the war was a global conflict and locate the main countries/participants involved on a world map. They will also identify the main trade routes for Britain and understand the reasons for the introduction of rationing during World War 2.

Religious Education:

We will continue to teach the children about different concepts. The children will consider and evaluate the concept of 'ritual' with a focus on Easter and the importance of the lighting of the Paschal candle to Christians. They will also be recognising and discussing the ideas about the concept of 'Jesus as divine' by looking at Christian miracle stories about Jesus.

P.D.L:

In our PDL unit, the children will learn about the importance of personal hygiene and understand how bacteria and viruses can affect health. They will also understand how important it is to keep a safe and healthy lifestyle. As well as that, they will understand how families are all different and the importance of respect and tolerance. Using what they know and have learnt, they will create a recipe to include qualities which are essential for a happy and loving family.

Art:

Children will learn about St Paul's Cathedral and how this became an iconic symbol of hope in WW2. They will be looking at the shapes and proportions of the building using different media. As a final piece, they will create an emotive pastel piece of artwork to create a sense of movement. The children will explore feathers, patterns and paint techniques to paint a realistic feather. They will then create their own wish feather combining their skills in pattern, line and colour.

Music:

During our singing unit, rounds and partner songs, the children will practise some traditional, spiritual songs and realise the importance of good breath control. They will learn to maintain a steady tempo whilst singing and consider the impact of varying tempo and dynamics to apply to their singing. The children will learn to sing a selection of wartime songs and realise how these songs lifted spirits during such difficult times. We will also learn the songs of Glen Miller, these will then be presented during the showcase assemblies.
