What I should already know?

- That people have different ideas and believe different things and that these are of equal value in British law.
- That beliefs, with deities are called religions.
- That people who believe the same thing often organise themselves into groups with spiritual leaders.
- That religious groups have rituals and practices, which are specific and sometimes unique to their religion.
- That religious groups often have special buildings in which they meet to worship.
- That religious groups often have special sacred books which they use in their worship and that these sacred writings often form the basis of their beliefs and tell them how to behave.
- Religious beliefs are regarded as the truth by believers.
- That the main religion in Britain is Christianity but there are also many other religious groups in our society.
