Medium term planner - Picnic in the Park

Title and duration: Picnic in the Park 6 Weeks

Year group: 5

Description: This theme is a comparison between a region in the UK and a region in North America. We have chosen to study Yellowstone National park and The South Downs National park. The children will look at similarities and differences in these regions and understand some of the reasons for them. They will extend their mapping skills to include four figure grid references.
