This role is much misunderstood by people outside school. It is so much more than the task of lunchtime supervision or being a 'dinner lady' and is key to ensuring lunchtimes are smooth and happy for children and staff. It involves organising staff timetables, leading Midday supervisor meetings with SLT and, most importantly, leading and managing lunchtime staff and systems so that our children get fed on time and teaching staff can get on with their lunch and get ready for the afternoon sessions. It also involves working with SLT on developing play provision at lunchtime - we are developing this further this year so it would be a good time to get involved with a new project. It needs someone who would be very organised, reliable and someone with a passion for children's play opportunities. It's also a good way of getting into our team as we always look to part-time staff if extra support hours or cover are needed in class (with relevant qualifications), Breakfast Club or Twilight.
