RED Hot Weather Warning from the Met Office

Breaking news today is the refreshed hot weather warning from the government. Schools have been given the following advice from Public Health:



"With temperatures expected to rise to temperatures of 30 degrees <u>and above</u>, over the weekend and into Monday and Tuesday (16th to 19th July), we are conscious that schools and early years settings may be encountering questions from families about whether your site is closing and if not, what measures are being taken to keep children well.

Our expectation is that schools and early years settings remain open, in accordance with the national guidance on managing hot weather. This includes making sure that children stay well hydrated, apply sun cream and keep to the shade while playing outdoors, as well as managing indoor temperatures safely and effectively. Staff are also advised to ensure that children do not take part in vigorous physical activity on very hot days, such as when temperatures exceed 30 degrees. Please do continue to communicate with parents and carers about all of these measures, and where their support is required to make sure that children are well prepared for the hotter weather. We would suggest that individual schools and early years settings consider being flexible in terms of relaxing uniform rules to help children stay cool and readjusting their time spent outdoors as appropriate. What Does this Mean for Herne?

We have started a risk assessment for next week, which we will be monitoring over the weekend. We know that Petersfield can be a little different and sometimes bucks the trend for weather due to the influence of Butser Hill. Expect snow for next week maybe??? Joking aside, we have already decided on the following measures for next week:

- Monday and Tuesday will be **non-uniform days**, meaning that families can choose for their children to wear clothing that will best keep them cool.
- Monday and Tuesday lunchtimes will be treated as 'wet lunchtimes', where children will be kept in their classrooms to eat
 lunch. We will allow minimal time outside, and even then, children must keep in the shade.
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Hot Weather Measures Continued...

- We have already purchased additional fans to use in school and have ordered more to arrive by Monday.
- Children will be reminded of the Slip, Slop, Slap messages, including having their water bottles in school all next week
- As it stands, we will proceed with Tuesday evening's Year 6 Leavers' Assembly, unless you hear otherwise.
- If it goes ahead that day (and predicted temperatures from 7pm is 25 degrees), then please think about very young children and elderly relatives (*if possible parents/carers only, would keep the audience numbers smaller and generate less heat!*)
- We are exploring the possibility of moving the Year 6 Leavers' Assembly, scheduled for Tuesday evening, to Wednesday evening next week in lieu of the Barn Dance (which would sadly have to be cancelled).
- We will keep Year 6 parents and carers informed and updated on Monday, but we have already looked into mobile air-con units for that evening.
- We will Tweet, text and email further updates as and when we are advised by government or local authority sources.

Leavers' Assembly

Just a reminder to Year 6 parents that on Tuesday 19th 7-9pm is the Year 6 Leavers' Production of *Jill and Fred's Most Hysterical Adventure*. There is plenty of parking at Churcher's College, or you can park at Herne and walk up through their bottom gate. The event will take place in the Sports Hall, which is through the main entrance and on the right. Children are to be dropped off at 6.40pm. The event is free, however our lovely librarian Mrs Pitt will be there if any Year 6 parent would like to pay £5 to donate a book to our school library (the book will be dedicated to your child in the inside cover).

Sports Day Update – Wednesday 20th July



At this stage, the Met Office is predicting a 40% chance of rain for Wednesday. It is unclear whether this could be thunderstorms after the hot start to the week or not. This means that we will need to consider safety if there is a risk of children slipping or if we are potentially putting children and staff in danger if there are storms. Trying our hardest not to be pessimistic, we still intend to proceed with Sports Day next Wednesday unless we are forced to reconsider this plan. All families can stay after the morning to have a picnic with their children on the school field. The temperatures for Wednesday are predicted to be in the

mid-20s, so this will still mean remaining vigilant for sun protection. There will be two water stations. Again, watch this space early next week for updates. Please note that if we do have to cancel the Sports Day, there is not a reserve date.

Sports Day Lunch

If your child has not pre-ordered the picnic lunch (they were given slips to bring home), please ensure they bring a packed lunch with them on Wednesday for Sports day. Thank you.

School Games Gold Award

Yesterday, we were very excited to hear the news that the school has been awarded the school games GOLD award for our excellence in sport. A big thank you to our PE leaders Miss Edmondson and Mrs Knight, as well as all the staff who have taken children to an array of external sporting events this year.

Year 6 SATS Reading Papers Update

As parents and carers will know from last week, the government managed to lose 64 reading papers, which has led to an incomplete set of results for 64 of our Year 6 pupils. This is an appalling situation and the school has taken this to the Standards and Testing Agency, officially complained to the Department for Education, contacted Damian Hinds MP and Mr Markham has raised this nationally with his union, the National Association of Headteachers. This has already become breaking news on the BBC (see our Twitter feed). The DfE telephoned the school this morning to clarify the numbers of papers missing and they are trying to pursue this issue. Library Open After School From September

The idea is to have the library open, for half an hour, for children, who will need to be accompanied by their parent/carer, to change books, read together or do homework. We think this is a great initiative to encourage parent engagement and reading for pleasure.

Simple Pencil Case Information for September – Repeat Information...

We have decided to continue asking for children to bring a simple pencil case for next academic year. Inside the pencil case they will require colour pencils (6-12 colours), small ruler (6 inch), rubber, pencil sharpener & a glue stick (Herne will provide writing pencils and pens). The pencil case will need to be small and simple because we want the children to keep it in their tray which is positioned under their desk. (they will stay in school and not come home every day). The first one pictured below is a simple £1.50 pencil case from WHSmith – this is a good size. Please no Smiggle (other brands are available) multi compartment pencil cases (they don't fit in the tray), they really need to be single zip and as small as possible (but still able to hold the necessary items). PE Uniform
