Bike Week 2018 (11th - 15th June)

Monday 11th June sees the start of another opportunity to come to school on two wheels. Bike Week is a nationwide initiative which

Governors' Update

Underlying all of the discussions and decisions that Governors make, the focus is on our pupils and the impact on their education and well-being. With this in mind, Governors have endorsed Mr Markham's proposal that, from September, a scheme will be introduced which will enable every pupil to be able to reach their expected reading age.

Governors understand that there are parents who find it difficult to listen to their child read on a regular basis. They also know that unless children are able to practice reading and grasp what they have read, they will inevitably not achieve a standard that equips

them in their education not only now, but later in life. Apart from gaining employment, the ability to use reading skills effectively will enable young people to grow into and access an adult world where reading is essential. Reading, as we know, is a necessity for most everyday tasks such as reading the instructions on a microwave meal or reading information on a smart-phone.



So if your child needs extra help, the school's staff are willing to be committed to give of their time before and after the normal school hours in order to enable ALL Herne pupils to reach their expected reading age. Governors are confident that parents will co-operate with the Compulsory Acceleration Programme initiative and look forward to knowing that all Herne pupils have mastered the skills in reading that are needed to make the best that life has to offer into the future. *Mary Fair (Chair of Governors).*

Choosing Classes for Next Academic Year

Every year, it has been the standard routine that we mix our classes as they move from one year group to the next. This has the advantage of giving the children a chance to make new friends and learn with new people, giving everyone a sense of a fresh start in September. To help this process along, we ask the children in Years 3, 4 and 5 to choose friends to go on their list of who they would like to be with in their new class.
