# Parents' Evenings in November

November will be Parents' Evening month at Herne. Each week in November, we will focus on a different year group where the teachers will offer a variety of appointments for you to select within the given week.

We will be using a new online booking system for parents to login and select an appointment slot. Then on the given day and time, the class teacher will ring the allocated parent for their 10-minute appointment. Teachers will ring the mobile number of the child's number 1 contact on their data sheet. If you would like the teacher to use a different number (such as a landline number) please write which phone number to use in the message box when you book the appointment on School Cloud.


This new parents' evening booking system does have the capabilities for video chats, so an allocated year group will be trialling this (to judge how this system works). If this year group applies to you, we'll let you know on your email from School Cloud. If the trial is successful, all future parents' evenings will cross over to video appointments through School Cloud, our new booking software. We ask that parents only book one slot per child. Year 3 parents should have already received their email from School Cloud (these appointments will be over the phone not video chats). Due to some initial set-up issues, which we're still working on, Years 4, 5 and 6 will receive their emails straight after half-term. One aspect that scuppered our earlier plans was that the software company that we were using for the last few years, has been bought out by the new software company we've invested in!

We are not notified of these payments, so this is the only way we will know that you have paid! Thank you.

#### Transfer to Secondary School in 2021

This is just a reminder to **Year 6 parents and carers** to complete their application for their child's year 7 place by 31st October 2020. Go to www.hants.gov.uk and click on 'Education and Learning' where a box at the top takes you to 'Applying for a School Place'.

1 to 4 days	Waiting to get a test or waiting for test results.	A wide range of resources on the Home Learning pages on our website (under the 'Children tab' then 'Home Learning'). There are links to daily lessons on 'Oak Academy' and there are many resources that match with the same learning that will be happening in class.
5 days or more	Staying at home due to critical health conditions, self-isolating due to a positive test in a member of the family or the child OR continued absence due to another COVID-related reason.	We have two allocated teachers to help families and their children:  Mrs Marlow: L.Marlow@hernejunior.com  A. N. Other Teacher – To be confirmed  Both of them are available to support the children. They can organise paper-based packs for the children (which can be collected from the school by someone or delivered by a member of staff to your address), listen to children read, recommend resources and be available to help support and motivate children who are home learning for a sustained period.
10 days or more	If there is a positive test at the school that closes a class Bubble or larger sections of the school	If there is a concern regarding either a confirmed case of Covid-19 or, on the advice of the NHS Business Services Authority (then Health Protection Team / Public Health England), the school may be required to close one Bubble (a class) or a Year Group or Upper or Lower School, or indeed the whole school. In an instant, anyone can then access on-line learning (already in place on our website – see first part of the table above) and, within the next few weeks, we have now signed up to 'Google Classrooms' which will give us an increased capacity to support learning at home. Watch this space.  Also, in Flyer No.2 on 4th September, we published every teacher's email address, allowing direct contact with your child's teacher where needed.
