## Changes to Lockdown - What's going to happen on Monday 29th March?

People will be allowed to meet outside, either with one other household or within the "rule of six", including in private gardens. The stay at home rule will end, but the government will urge people to stay local as much as possible. Outdoor sport facilities will reopen, including golf courses and tennis and basketball courts, and formally organised outdoor sports can restart. Weddings can take place, attended by up to six people

#### Stage two (no earlier than 12th April):

All shops allowed to open, along with close-contact services, including hairdressers and beauty salons (including in people's homes). Restaurants and pubs allowed to serve food and alcohol to customers sitting outdoors. Gyms and spas can reopen, as can zoos, theme parks, libraries and community centres. Members of the same household can take a holiday in the UK in self-contained accommodation. Weddings attended by up to 15 people can take place

Many people in our community may have benefitted from this FREE volunteer service, which saves the NHS hundreds of thousands of pounds every year. The group, who mainly operate on their own motorcycles or use one of the small fleet of vehicles, run around between hospitals at the

weekends and throughout the night, 365 days a year. They also ensure that the air ambulance is able to carry vital supplies of blood and saline by running between Southampton General Hospital and Thruxton (where the air ambulance is based) every other day.
