Physical Education / Games Inside

Children will learn skills related to outdoor orienteering, using the extensive school grounds to achieve this.

Outside

During outdoor PE sessions, children will enhance their athletic skills ahead of the whole school Sports Day. Within their games sessions, children will develop their striking and fielding skills through playing Stoolball and Rounders.

French

L'avenir

As well as continuing to revise key vocabulary used in the Autumn and Spring terms and across the year groups, the children will also learn new phrases and vocabulary relating to holidays and activities they may persue.

Design and Technology

Circus Vehicles

Through linking to our book 'WildBoy', children will plan, create and evaluate a mechanised vehicle for one of the characters, ensuring they have included specific details for their character's needs or that relate to their personality.

Computing:

Pupils will make use of Green Screen technology to create an informative video linking to their theme work. They will also look at the advanced functionality of Scratch, using these control elements to further their knowledge with this program.

Religious Education:

Children will discover and explore their beliefs and thoughts about Jesus, and how other people perceive him, through the medium of art.

PSHE:

Children will be taught the next step in their Relationship and Sex Education by looking at Puberty and Reproduction. Links to parents will be made to share our scheme of work and the content of the lessons before they are taught. There will also be lessons on how to adjust to change, in order to prepare the children for their move to secondary school.

Art:

The children will study a Victorian artist – William Morris. They will recreate a pattern using inspiration from nature in the style of his work. They will also look at the work of Lowry and create some of his 'Matchstick Men' against an industrial background as a collaborative project.

Science

We will continue to look at evolution and how animals have adapted over time, so they can compete and survive in their natural habitats. Furthermore, we will look at Animals and Living things and the five kingdoms of life.

Music:

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In Music the children will listen to and appraise the work of Elgar, an English Victorian composer.
