French

The children will look at the basic words for food and drink.

They will plan menus before taking part in a French café activity.

Design and Technology

The children will design and make a South Downs omelette.

The focus of the unit will be using local ingredients to develop tasty flavour combinations.

They will also look at the safety measures needed for cooking.

Computing:

The children will look at different forms of communication using the internet. They will start by setting up their own email addresses, sending emails with attachments and looking at the risks involved with opening e-mails from unknown senders. The children will then investigate what makes a good blog before designing, researching and producing their class blog. Throughout the unit they will think about the appropriate tone and language that should be used.

Religious Education:

The children will look at the concept of community. They will discover how Hajj contributes to a sense of 'Umma' for Muslims and evaluate its importance to them. Finally they will consider the value of community in our own lives and how a sense of community affects their lives and the lives of others.

P.D.L:

The children will learn about puberty so that they can understand the changes that their bodies will begin to go through as they grow up in the next few years. They will have the opportunity to learn and discuss how they can deal with these changes. They will look at both the physical and emotional changes, which they may experience at this sensitive time.

Art:

The children will learn about famous Architects and will be asked to consider and discuss whether Architecture is an art form? They will look at the work of the famous illustrator James Gulliver Hancock, an artist who is inspired by architecture around the world. This unit will allow the children to experiment with drawing buildings in his style and to make 3D models, which will be used to create a city sculpture. The children will also be encouraged to appreciate their local architecture in and around Petersfield.

History:

Music:

The children will develop their understanding of the history of music by looking at the music composed by Benjamin Britten. They will listen to his piece, 'The Storm' and respond creatively. They will then compose their own storm piece, thinking about the different elements of music and using musical notation to record their ideas.
