- Check your child understands any new or unfamiliar vocabulary
- Adapt any of the resources and materials as you feel necessary to support your child's needs


Reading comprehension sequence

Explore this picture from the opening to the book and discuss the following questions.


Have you ever been to a circus or magic show?

What do you think the children will find in the tent?




1. Vocabulary and Prediction

Based on the front cover, title and what you know about circuses, which words hit the target? Discuss which words you would put in the bullseye – these will be the ones that you think will be most relevant to the book.



2. Developing reading with expression




Read and enjoy together the next two pages.

Discuss why the author has used different fonts, sizes and formats.

Focus on how the format of the text supports how we will read the story.


Practice and perform the story using:

- *Expression*
- *Pace*
- *Volume*



3. Summarising

Use your predictions, knowledge of magic and circuses and the extracts you have read to summarise what the story is about. Think about the key information you know to help you with this summary.



Who is the main character?

What can we tell about the main character from the front cover and extract?

Where is the story set?

Which other characters are in the story?

What might these characters be like?

Quick quiz

Use the extracts to discuss and answer these questions.

1. What does '*edging forward in the dark*' tell you about how Leon is feeling?
2. What word could you use instead of '*solemn*' to describe the monkey?
3. What types of toys are in the tent?
4. How do these toys move?
