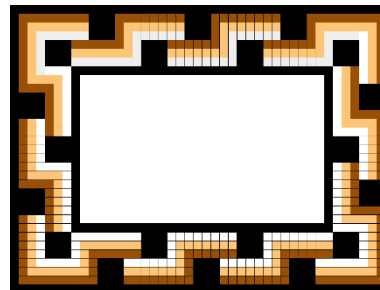

Key Knowledge

Generate realistic ideas and design criteria collaboratively through discussion, focusing on the needs of the user and purpose of the product.

Think ahead about the order of their work and decide upon tools and materials.

Plan a sequence of actions to make a product.

Record the plan by drawing (labelled sketched) or writing.

Create frame structure, strengthen frames with diagonal struts.

Measure and mark square selection, strip and dowel accordingly to 1cm.

Use glue gun with close supervision (one to one).

Test and evaluate their own products against design criteria and the intended user and purpose.

Use finishing and decorative techniques.
