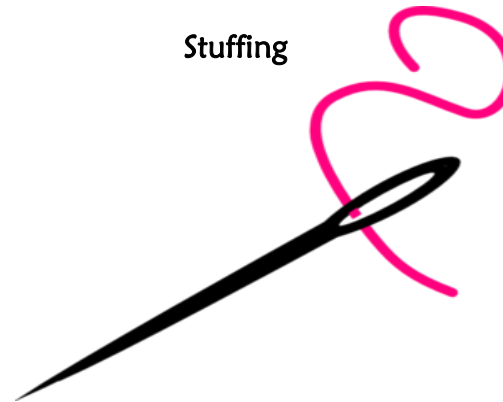

Key Knowledge

Use appropriate decoration techniques e.g. applique (glued or simple stitches).

Understand how to securely join two pieces of fabric together.

Identify the strengths and weaknesses of their design ideas.

Test their product against the original design criteria and with the intended user.
