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## CLIMATE EMERGENCY! A Day of Demonstration



You may be aware that today has been a historic day which started in the early hours in places like Australia. Friday 20<sup>th</sup> September was the National Climate Strike; one event taking place right here in Petersfield town centre. This was originally planned as a youth strike, organised by Greta Thunberg, but as some of you may agree, this is not a job that just our youths should be tackling on their own. They called upon adults to take to the streets and make their voices heard as well. We were asked by members of many of our classes (especially in Year 6) if they could take part in this action. ## IMPORTANT! Y6 applying for your child's secondary school place

Applications for secondary schools for Hampshire residents are now open. You can apply online via the Education Online Portal at: [www.hants.gov.uk/admissions](http://www.hants.gov.uk/admissions) You must apply to Hampshire County Council even if you wish to apply for schools in another local authority. If you do not live in Hampshire (including Portsmouth and Southampton) you must apply through your home local authority.

If you have used the Education Online Portal previously, you will be able to log in using the same e-mail address and password. Please check your details are up-to-date in the 'My Account' section of the portal before starting your school application.

If you have not used the online portal before, you will need to register by clicking on the 'Register' button and following the onscreen instructions. You will be sent an email from the system containing a link to the log in screen. You will then be able to log in using your e-mail address and password.

**The deadline for applications is midnight on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2019..**

It is very important that you submit your application by this date. Applications received after the deadline will not be considered until after all on-time applications have been processed, which means late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools. Before completing your application, you are advised to read the online guidance about applying for a school place available at [www.hants.gov.uk/admissions](http://www.hants.gov.uk/admissions). The website also contains an A – Z of all Hampshire maintained schools, including details of each school's admission arrangements, contact details, Ofsted reports etc. If you are unable to apply online, you can request a paper form from us.

## FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT AND ADDITIONAL FUNDING

If your child is entitled to free school meals we ask that you register them for this, even if they do not want to have a school meal, as it means the school qualifies for additional funding. This additional money is called 'Pupil Premium' funding and equates to currently **£1,320** for each eligible child. With school budgets being cut drastically, it is therefore vital that we ensure that we get all money to which we are entitled, so that we can give all our children the best support possible.



### Service children:

Please can Armed Service parents (any parent who has been in the armed forces within the last six years) register their child by informing the school office. By doing this, the school will be able to claim **£300** a year for each child registered as having a Service parent. If a couple are divorced and the child/children are now living with their mother and a partner not in the services, as long as the birth parent is still in the services, then the child can still be registered as a service child. Also, if a mother and her children are living with someone who is in the services, even if they are not married, the children can also be registered as service children. The school now runs specialist programmes to support Service Children with the core subjects and wider curriculum.

### Further funding available:

There is also funding available for us to claim if your child was in care and has since been adopted by you. For these children, we can claim **£1,900** per child. For any child who is currently 'in care' or 'looked after' we can claim the same amount. Once again, please come and inform the office. If you are not sure if your child is eligible, please come and ask at the office. As with all these matters, this will be dealt with privately and you can request a confidential meeting with one of our senior staff if you'd prefer.

## Phones in School



We would like to remind parents and children that if a mobile phone is brought into school, it must not be used at the beginning of the school day. Once in school it has to be handed in to the teacher who will put it into the classroom locker for safe keeping. We cannot be held responsible for this property, but recognise that some families choose to contact their child directly at the end of the school day via this method. Could we also highlight that phones must not be used for photographing or videoing on the school premises and that children of primary age should not have access to social media sites. Thank you.
