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## A Note from Mrs Sayers

Dear Parents and Carers,

I'm so sorry about this...I try to avoid this on Flyers but I need to have a good grizzle!! **Parking** is not only becoming the bane of our lives, it is becoming dangerous and taking up far too much time away from focusing on the children!

I know we are all busy but please do not park in the staff car park in the morning or end of the school day unless you have a Disability pass. **Drop and go please.** In the afternoon, after clubs, there are often empty spaces at 4.30 pm+, you may use spaces in the first section of the car park but please do not park in the section nearest to school (opposite the minibuses) OR park over other cars OR leave your engine running while you "nip out" as this leads to a tailback not to mention the danger of exhaust fumes!

OK...grizzle over...please help us!!



## OPEN MORNING FOR PROSPECTIVE PARENTS FOR HERNE & TPS

## Doodle Back-to-School Competition
