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A Note from our Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

Hope you had a good half term. It's been a fairly quiet first week back.



Just before we broke up...and too late for the last flyer...we had two wonderful **football** outcomes to celebrate. The **National League Trust Under 11s Tournament** is a 6-a-side football competition for local schools, with all National League Clubs invited to enter. Herne girls were playing on behalf of Havant & Waterlooville (after winning their qualifying tournament) and headed off to Walton & Hersham FC on the Thursday before half-term. The format was simple – a round

of group games with the stronger teams progressing to the knockout phase. Despite the awful conditions, Herne started with energy and enthusiasm easily winning the first game 3-0. The weather showed no sign of improving as the girls battled their way through the rest of the group and having come second overall in the group stage, were immediately hurled into a

semi-final. This ended in the dreaded sudden death penalty shootout. Herne secured their place in the final!!

The final was another tense game against Slough who sadly got the better of us, and so were crowned winners overall. The unexpected good news? Both teams qualify for the next round so dreams of a shot at Wembley remain very much alive!! A big 'Thank You' to our minibus driver/pitch-side reporter, Mr Hurst.



Then on the Friday before half-term, two girls football teams went to the **Southampton Primary Stars Event** to compete against 28 other girls teams. Our blue team, after the league stage, got placed into the second-tier event but went on to win their final. Our pink team, won eight games in a row to reach the top tier final, but sadly lost their nineth game to take the silver medal. Second out of 28 teams is still a magnificent achievement. Huge Congratulations to all our young girls football players.



On Monday, we will be sending home a 'Mid-Year Assessment Postcard' to inform parents how their child is progressing with their learning so far, this academic year. The postcard will contain a grading for their effort in class, an academic progress grading and an indicator of whether your child is 'On Track' to meet the expectations of their current year group. This will be based on their Teacher's Assessment of their academic performance (TA)

and their latest test scores (TEST) they achieved in the mid-year assessment tests that the children have just taken. There will not be a test grading for writing, as the children do not take writing tests in the national curriculum.

We hope you find this short summary of information useful, as we reach the halfway point of this academic year. One of the benefits of sharing this key information before Parents' Evenings, is that we hope it will save time in these meetings, so conversations can be directed to the areas of most need.
